Included in this month's newsletter are the Rules and Regulations for submitting plants for judging. We always have these available during registration, but everyone is too busy to read them so please take a few minutes and read through them. Of course the most important rule is to be sure the plant is free of pests (aphids, ants, mealy bugs, scale) and disease. The judges like to see well-groomed plants, so you will want to cut off any dead or sunburned leaves. Wiping down the leaves with a diluted mixture of milk and water will give the leaves a nice shine and also help get rid of pests that may be hiding under the leaves. Please bring in ALL your blooming plants. This makes for a beautiful show and gives you the chance to win more ribbons. We will also have AOS and CSA judging if you have something extraordinary for judging. Plant registration is on Friday, Sept. 24, beginning at 4:00pm and ending at 9:00pm.

Our show committee chairs need your help! Their requests for sign-ups were met with very little response at our last meeting. Make their jobs easier by contacting them to offer your help. We need lots of food to feed our hungry workers and the vendors, so when you sign up to be a host, also sign up to bring a pot luck dish. There are a lot of tables to set up for the show, so we could use some muscles as well as the not so strong to drape the tables. Ron also needs people to help move equipment from our storage facility to the Garden. We need everyone's help to make this a successful and well-run show.

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It's Showtime

Remember everyone that this is the month for our Fall Show—We want to see everyone show up at the South Coast Botanic Garden (26300 Crenshaw Boulevard—Palos Verdes Peninsula) on Saturday and Sunday, September 25 and 26. Yes, that's right, one week after our regular meeting. So, this page is dedicated to the show, and we won't have a culture article this month.

Several speakers have promised to be on hand for the show this fall:

Saturday:

- **Mr. Jim** Rowley—Jim will speak on how to grow orchids hydroponically. Learn about media and methods for growing your orchids in this very unique way.
- Mr. Jack Manchester—Jack (alias Dr. Potsalot) will tell us how to be successful growing Paphs. Jack is a Paphiopedilum master grower and has given us countless tips about growing our orchids (Ed.—I have copies of a lot of the old Dr. Potsalot columns courtesy Marly Corew, and will start to intersperse them in when I get a chance).
- Mr. Mark Gibbel—Mark will provide us information about alternatives to growing in bark. Mark is a big proponent of coconut, and will provide us the pros and cons of different media than bark. Mark is a master cymbidium grower.
- **Dr. Nick Breamer**—Other than growing his plants in what comes out of the back end of a horse, Nick is something of a species nut. He will talk about growing your orchids outside and will give us hints about potting and mounting our plants so that they are happy and produce lots of flowers.

Sunday:

- **Dr. Nick Breamer**—Nick will give us a repeat performance for anyone that misses his talk Saturday
- **Mr. Jim Weiss**—Jim's business is The Orchid Garden, and Jim will give us an overview of cymbidium growing, potting, and getting the best out of our plants.
- **Mr. Mark Gibbel**—Another encore performance is planned for Sunday in case you miss the coconut and fertilizer talk on Saturday.

Remember to tell your friends, neighbors, acquaintances, people you meet in the grocery store, people you meet at the health club, anyone that might be interested in seeing an absolutely gorgeous display of some of the best flowers and plants that the South Bay has to offer. Admission to the South Coast Botanic Garden is \$7, but once you pay the \$7 the rest of the show is free.

There is a poster on the show website (www.southbayorchidsocietyshow.com) that John Jaacks put together. I can e-mail anyone a bitmap that they can print or mail to any of their friends or acquaintances. The poster is very nice.

Rules and Regulations for Showing Your Orchids

Since the SBOS Fall Show is upon us, we thought that it would be a good idea to let everyone know what the rules are for showing your orchids at both of our shows. These rules are pretty much common sense, but it isn't a bad idea to state them so that everyone knows what they are supposed to so. That way, the ribbons that you get will actually mean something. In any case, the rules follow:

- This show is open to all who wish to exhibit their orchids. Plants may be entered in one classification only. NO CROSS FILING. To be eligible for judging, a plant must have been grown by the exhibitor for at least 120 days prior to the show. Other plants may be entered for "exhibit only".
- 2. Entries will be received at the South Coast Botanic Garden from 4:00 PM until 9:00 PM on Friday, September 24.
- 3. Each exhibitor agrees upon making entries, to abide by the rules and regulations of the show.
- 4. The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse entry of any plant thought to be diseased or infested.
- 5. No entries or ribbons may be removed until 5:00 PM on Sunday, September 26.
- 6. Entries not removed by 5:30 PM Sunday night will be removed by the Show Committee. Any plants not claimed in ten days will be disposed of by the Show Committee.
- 7. Every precaution will be taken by the Show Committee to protect the property of the exhibitors. The South Bay Orchid Society, South Coast Botanic Garden, and the Show Committee cannot be responsible for loss or damage to plants or materials.
- 8. Staging and tables will be furnished by the Show Committee. All other materials must be furnished by the exhibitor and must be flameproof

Judging

- Judging will commence at 9:00 AM on Saturday, September 25, and must be completed by 12:00 noon. Only judges will be allowed in the Showroom during judging.
- The competitive system of judging will be used for awards. First, Second, and Third place ribbons will be awarded in each group. If without merit, judges can make no award. Trophies will be awarded for each class if warranted. No judge may judge his/her own plant.
- All entries checked in by an official of the show will be entered for competitive judging unless
 otherwise stated on the entry form. All plants must be labeled with the name or cross in order
 to be judged. Unlabeled plants may be entered for "exhibit only".
