This months Speaker is **Ron Coleman**. And he will speak on "**The Orchids of the Westcoast of America**."

Ron is a retired electronics engineer living in Tucson, AZ. He has been growing orchids in a green house for over 30 years. His plants have won several American Orchid Society awards such as CCM, HCC and AM. Ron has served as president of the Ventura County and Thousand Oaks Orchid Societies. His interest in native orchids dates from a chance discovery of *Corallorhiza mertensiana* in Washington in 1972.

Ron is a frequently published author with over 30 orchid articles to his credit, most dealing with native orchids. They have appeared in the American Orchid Society Bulletin (now know as Orchids), The Orchid Digest, Fremontia, Selbyana, and Madrano.

Ron is the author of *The Wild Orchids of California*, published in 1995 and *The Wild Orchids of Arizona and New Mexico*, published in 2002. He co-authored the orchid treatment in *Arizona Rare Plant Field Guide* prepared by the Arizona Rare Plant Committee, and was co-author of two orchid genus treatments in the *Flora of North America*, Vol 2, published in 2002.

Ron was asked and accepted the position of editor for the orchid section of the planned revision to the Jepson Manual Flora of California and will write major portions the orchid treatment. Ron is on the publication committee for the Native Orchid Conference, responsible for publishing the quarterly Native Orchid Journal. He enjoys searching for wild orchids wherever he may be and has found them in England; Puerto Rico; Canada, including Newfoundland; and Alaska, as well as most parts of the lower 48 states.

Orchid Tips:

It's not over until all the pseudobulbs are brown and mushy. Then it's over.



There are many stories of orchids that have been 'given up for dead' by their owners only to gloriously re-bloom at a later date. The good news is that if the temperature was above the critical degree point for your type of orchid, for some of you the plants may not have been actually killed. Perhaps the pseudobulbs are still intact even though the leaves are gone. If so, it may begin a new leaf growth soon. A few months later, it may begin another. Years later, this orchid may return with a vengeance.

This picture is of cold damage on a Phalaenopsis. Cut off the damage and take care to keep it away from cold. On some of my plants with thin leaves, I lost all the leaves, but the bulbs are still green and firm. I am hopeful that they will recover. Let me know how your plants are recovering. We could all learn from this cold disaster so maybe, just maybe some good may come of it.
