Currently, a quarter of Hawaii's native flora are gone. However, recently a botanist searched and found the last surviving Green Fringed orchid, he found her knee deep in mud in Kaua'i's Alaka'i Swamp, just a dozen miles from Mount Wai'ale'ale, the second wettest place on earth. The natives believe that with respect to the native flora, that "If we see them thriving, we know as a people we too will thrive." This was a very special mission. Field botanist, Steve Perlman, of the National Tropical Botanical Garden, collected seeds from the rarest of the Hawaiian orchids. Botanist believe there is only one plant left on the island and they feared it would not survive past spring 2008. In fact, the only reason it survived to be found is that it was growing in a swamp and the swamp is pig proof.

Pigs, Ginger, common garden plants introduced into the system when the wind blows seeds from local household gardens, and Climate Change are leading to the extinction of many plants like the Fringed Orchid. Hawaii's wild pigs actions are like living rototillers destroying the native fauna. Hawaii's Ginger plants are invading the ecosystem—nothing can germinate and grow under the shade of ginger and it is **spreading**. Climate change is adding increasingly severe storms, tearing the life out of the ecosystem. Thus the importance of Steve Perlman's endeavor.

From three tiny stems he collected hundreds of dust size seeds. In the past, artificial propagation of the Green Fringed orchid failed. However, much hope is placed on the current attempt to propagate. The following day Mr. Perlman shipped the vial of seed pods to orchid specialist Larry Zettler, professor of biology at Illinois College.

Professor Zettler directs the Orchid Recovery Program, an ongoing research project aimed at growing North

America's rare, threatened and endangered native orchids from seed using fungi. Apparently, while there is a proliferation of orchid species and hybrids in the market, our own native orchids are endangered. Professor Kettler, sowed the sees and they are in incubation. At last reported check, the embryos appeared to be well. Platanthera species, Prof. Kettler states, in general take considerable time in vitro, especially without fungi. However, he feels confident this plant will respond better using an asymbiotic technique. In other words, after extensive research and work growing orchids in different fungi typically associated with the plant in the wild., Zettler is coming to the conclusion that he might have better luck not using fungi at all. His finding are consistent with a recent breakthrough in orchid growing at the Atlanta Botanical Garden.



At the Atlanta Botanical Garden tissue culture, also known as micro-propagation, allows for the rapid propagation of a large quantity of plants from a very small amount of original plant material.

The Ron Determann Tissue Culture Laboratory at the Atlanta Botanical Garden conservation program helps propagate hard to propagate plants such as the terrestrial orchids native to the south-eastern United States.

Propagation techniques used by Zettler and independently by the Determann Tissue Culture Laboratory show great promise for saving engendered North American orchids.

We know this little guy can make it and hope to soon hear the good news that it is being reintroduced into the Hawaiian ecosystem. Mahalo!
