What we want from our Orchid Society and why we are: "<u>Orchids for Amateurs</u>"

The feedback, opinions, comments I received from the survey I initiated upon the start of my presidential run revealed the following facts:

Everyone wants to keep an orchid healthy, make it thrive, get it to grow, divide it, or nurture it to a specimen size plant and eventually make it bloom. It's also great if that one special orchid wins a few ribbons along the way or a best of class, section or show. We hear our guest speakers tell us what works for their orchids and how we should follow all their advice and wisdom of their vast knowledge. We have seen hundreds of orchids growing in situ in the presentations and awe and gawk at the abundant blooms and quantity/size of the plants. This is splendid but these plants have adapted over hundreds of years to their particular environment. Nature decides where they will take root, when they will put out new growth, throw out an inflorescence, multiply, or die. The orchids in the wild don't worry about PH, candle power, fertilizer, water, shade, light, media, repotting, size of container they're growing in, etc... All of these factors are dictated by where the orchid is growing and what it's growing on or in.

The board of directors will rotate the presidency among the elected members on a monthly basis for the following year to insure continuity in the society's ongoing activities.
