Brandon Tam has been growing orchids since the age of seven starting with a white flowering Cymbidium his grandmother gave to him. She has been the source of his inspiration to further his studies within the botanical world and pursue a career within that field. She would bring him to their local nursery where she would let him pick a plant each time they went. Over time, not only did his orchid collection grow, but his knowledge in that field did too.

At the age of fourteen, he began volunteering at The Huntington Library, Art Collections and Botanical Gardens where he helped out among the different areas of the institution. From tending to the plants of the Conservatory to database entry of pressed specimens in the Herbarium, there were always plenty of opportunities to guench his thirst for plant knowledge.

When Brandon turned sixteen, he graduated from high school and began attending college. In December of 2014, he graduated from the California State University, Pomona at the age of twenty one, with a Bachelor in Plant Science. A few months after graduating high school, the Director of the Botanical Gardens at The Huntington offered him an internship within Orchids to reorganize and perpetuate the collection. Currently at the age of twenty one, he is an Orchid Specialist specializing mostly in Paphiopedilums since a large chunk of the collection at The Huntington consists of that specific genus. The collection contains roughly 16,000 plants.

During his first six months at The Huntington, one of his first tasks with the institution was the accession The Edelbrock Cattleya Collection and the relocation of the Cymbidium Collection to further consolidate the group. Three months later, news came to The Huntington that they would be the recipient of the prestigious S. Robert Weltz Orchid Collection from the city of Montecito in Santa Barbara, California. After receiving the acquisition, Brandon was tasked with taking 28,000 photos of the plants and inventorying/accessioning the collection. As of today, he deals with the day to day operations of curating the collection and lab propagation of rare species.

Brandon stays active in the orchid world by being a member of seven different orchid societies located all over Southern California. He participates in Orchid shows and judging regularly while giving talks to societies in his free time. As of now, his ability to do talks in societies is very limited due to his busy schedule working full time, both at work and as a student.



Congratulations to Dr. Bob Streeter Orchid Digest Diamond Award of Excellence Winner!



Dr. Robert "Bob" Streeter has been a very active member of our society since joining in 1977. He served as President in 1982 and 1983. Bob's dedication, enthusiasm, and support to the society is unwavering. He's currently Director Emeritus on our board.

Bob is responsible for organizing the judging at all our shows; he's an accredited CSA judge and and was the CSA award chairman for twenty years. He also judges other local societies' events and shows. Bob is very helpful, especially to guests or newer members, by answering their questions and attending to their needs; he's constantly encouraging everyone in the society to participate, volunteer, and help out with the affairs of the society. Bob was awarded a US patent # PP8,541P for his Cattleya loddigesii var. Harrisoniana 'Streeter's Choice' FCC/AOS in 1993. This bifoliate plant features exceptional substance, magnificent form, and superior flower quality; it is a larger, flatter, more rounded flower with a much longer blooming period. This plant has also been awarded the AOS 'Max' award and a Silver Medal at the WOC in Brazil.

Since his first orchids (Cattleyas) 61 years ago, he has accumulated hundreds of plants. He has enjoyed attending four World Orchid Congresses, has received several CSA and AOS awards. He served one term on the AOS Research Committee and has been hybridizing Cymbidiums and Cattleyas for several years.

Bob is now 88 and has said "that growing this many orchids would either kill him or keep him alive. Guess the latter is winning."

The South Bay Orchid Society is pleased to honor Dr. Bob with great thanks and congratulate him for receiving this much deserved award for his "excellence" for all his years of service.
