Our July 19, 2019 guest speaker will be David Konishi "All About Plumerias"

This month's speaker is David Konishi, owner of Konishi Plumerias in Cypress, California. Since quite a few of our orchid society members are growing fragrant Plumerias we decided to invite David to give us some cultural and growing tips on how to get our trees to thrive and bloom. David is an excellent grower and hybridizer of Plumerias. He's involved with the South Coast Plumeria Society and is one of the administrators of the Plumeria Growers page on Facebook. The Plumerias love our South Bay climate and grow very readily with little care. Plumeria flowers are most fragrant at night in order to lure sphinx moths to pollinate them. The flowers yield no nectar and simply trick their pollinators. The moths inadvertently pollinate them by transferring pollen from flower to flower in their fruitless search for nectar. Insects or human pollination can help create new varieties of Plumeria. Plumeria trees from cross pollinated seeds may show characteristics of the mother tree or their flowers might just have a totally different new look.

The genus is named in honor of the seventeenth-century French botanist Charles Plumier, who traveled to the New World documenting many plant and animal species. The common name "frangipani" comes from a sixteenth-century marquis of the noble family in Italy who claimed to invent a plumeria-scented perfume, but in reality made a synthetic perfume that was said at the time to resemble the odor of the recently discovered flowers.

**Plumeria**\* is a genus of flowering plants in the dogbane family, Apocynaceae. Most species are deciduous shrubs or small trees. The species are indigenous to Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean, and as far south as Brazil and north as Florida, but are grown as cosmopolitan ornamentals in warm regions. Common names for plants in the genus vary widely according to region, variety, and whim, but Frangipani or variations on that theme are the most common.


























## **Membership Renewal**
