Speaker will be Peter Lin
"The Three A's of the Orchid
World: Angraecum, Aerangis
and Aeranthes"

Peter Lin was bitten by the orchid bug a long time ago. You will probably see him at the shows and sales throughout California. He has been an American Orchid Society judge for over a decade, and is now the Chair of the Long Beach supplemental judging center. He has served as President of Orchid Digest corporation.

One of Peter's focuses has been breeding 'mini-Catts', very small Cattleya-alliance hybrids with big flowers. His collection is full of specimens from every major group of orchids. To get an idea of his interests, you might look at his personal Facebook profile, or the <u>Facebook page for Diamond Orchids</u> (his business). The <u>Diamond Orchid website</u> is full of information and pictures. Along with the mini-catts, there are plenty of unusual, surprising, and sometimes just strange species that have caught his attention.

Peter is an Accredited Judge in the AOS Pacific South Judging Region. He has served as a judge for over a decade, and has been the Chair of the Long Beach Center within the Pacific South Judging Center for much of that time.

Part of Peter's collection is housed at Sunset Valley Orchids in Vista. When you visit Sunset Valley Orchids for one of their events, you may see Peter at work in his collection.

Angraecum orchids or Comet Orchids mostly come from Africa or Madagascar. The most famous species is the Christmas Orchid, Angraecum sesquipedale. These plants are monopodial, meaning there's a single stem which grows with alternating leaves and flower stems. Roots emerge from just above the leaves. Angraecums generally grow as epiphytes, but a few are lithophytes. Some are large and others are very small; some grow upright while others hang down. They are pollinated by moths: the white flowers of most species and fragrance of the flowers at night make them attractive to moths. The flowers may also be yellow, green or ochre. They have a long spur at the back of the labellum (lip). Some species have one flower on one inflorescence, while others (https://www.orchid-careproduce several. tips.com/angraecum.html)

The **Aerangis** genus comprises many tropical orchids which can be distinguished by their white star-shaped flowers. The genus contains about 50 plants, and though they mostly originate in tropical regions of Africa, a few are also native to the islands of the Indian ocean. These orchids are epiphytes-plants that grow attached to trees. They are often grown in hanging baskets or mounted on vertical surfaces. The most distinctive feature of an Aerangis plant is its waxy flowers which are usually white or yellow and shaped like a five-pointed star. They have pleasant aroma and bloom regularly. Aeranthes (pronounced air-ANN-theez) are mostly found in Madagascar and the adjacent islands off the east coast of Africa. They have translucent yellow, green, or white flowers on stems up to three feet long and are allied to Angraecum. There are 43 recognized species and 2 varieties of Aeranthes. The flowers vary in size but can be up to 4 inches wide and 5 inches tall and are often slightly fragrant. They prefer intermediate to warm humid conditions and around 70% shade. 
